Isaiah 65:17-25

19 I will rejoice in Jerusalem, and delight in my people;

20 No more shall there be in it an infant that lives but a few days, or an old person who does not live
out a lifetime; for one who dies at a hundred years will be considered a youth, and one who falls short
of a hundred will be considered accursed.

for like the days of a tree shall the days of my people be, and my chosen shall long enjoy the work of
their hands.
